# **Accomplishments:**

## **School Safety Assessments:**

5 District/47 Schools

Conducted 47 school safety assessments for 5 school districts (Picayune, Jackson County, Holmes, Philadelphia, and South Tippah) to include follow up technical assistance to bring the districts into compliance with accreditation standards for school safety.
